## 8<sup>th</sup> Annual Matthew Miller Memorial Sporting Clays Tournament

I am not sure everyone is familiar with this particular event. This is the brief history:

In January of 2002, my brother and friend, was taken suddenly and tragically from us in a car accident. Matt was so full of life, funny, and would give someone in need his last breathe if that would help them out and needless to say our family has never been the same as there always will remain the void that was left by his passing.

Later in 2002, Cajun Elite, was built and developed into the beginnings of what it is today. This endeavor was taken on by my Dad, Matt's Dad, to help fill his mind with something while he was going through the greatest grief a man could feel, the loss of his child.

In October 2002, Cajun Elite threw its very first tournament named in honor of Matt. Matthew would volunteer a large number of hours at the local oil and gas festival setting up single stack throwers and letting out his own guns to help in any way he could. This is why the event was not only named in his honor but all proceeds are donated to the St Joseph's Church in his name for the oil and gas festival.

In 2004, we sat down and looked at the allocation of these funds and decided that Matt would be honored and proud if we also helped area youth in learning more about this sport and developed them for the game of sporting clays. We decided to put part of the money that we made on the event aside to cover costs of the 4-H shooting sports program in Acadia parish. This money covers a large portion of the cost for targets for them to practice to compete.

We have made so many great friends through the shooting sports industry and we would appreciate any support that you can give us for this event.
